Grant Awards 2013**

- \$15,000 Glens Falls Hospital, toward hiring .5FTE (Full-time Equivalent) Care Coordinator in the Cambridge Family Health Center.
- \$15,000 Glens Falls Hospital, toward hiring .5FTE (Full-time Equivalent) Care Coordinator in the Greenwich Regional medical Center
- \$15,000 Glens Falls Hospital, toward hiring .5FTE (Full-time Equivalent) Care Coordinator in the Hoosick Falls Family Health Center
- \$15,000 Glens Falls Hospital, toward hiring .5FTE (Full-time Equivalent) Care Coordinator in the Salem Family Health Center.
- \$9,000 to the Cambridge Valley Rescue Squad for the purchase of EMS Equipment including a power stretcher, portable suction units, child restraints, pelvic splint and an electric cooler.
- \$16,000 to the Cambridge Valley Rescue Squad (CVRS) for tuition assistance for the training and certification of paramedics through Hudson Valley Community College.
- \$5,000 to the Cambridge Valley Rescue Squad (CVRS) toward the planning and development of a collaborative Mobile Health Care Program—particularly focused on the Elder Check Program.
- \$15,000 to the Easton-Greenwich Rescue Squad. to purchase three (3) power lift stretchers.
- \$11,000 to The Salem Rescue Squad, Inc. to purchase (1) a Masimo Rad-57 pulse CO-Oximeter (2) a Tank Boss—an oxygen move/lift system, and (3) portable radios, pagers and related accessories
- \$10,000 to the Fort Hudson Health System, Inc. The purpose of the funds is to partially support the purchase and installation of an electronic health record system for the Fort Hudson Certified Home Health Agency.
- \$12,000 to the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program of Warren and Washington Counties for its volunteer medical transportation program in Southern Washington County in 2014-- to partially support equipment, service delivery programs (mileage reimbursement for volunteer drivers) and outreach efforts.
- \$6,000 to partially fund the participation of leaders of the Cambridge Valley, Salem and Easton-Greenwich rescue squads to attend the Pinnacle EMS Leadership Conference particularly to learn more about and begin to study the feasibility of implementing Community Paramedicine locally.
