The Mary McClellan Foundation List of 2020 Grant Recipients

We are pleased to announce this year's awards:

Battenkill Community Services, Inc. was awarded \$20,000 to help hire a Registered Nurse. This would allow BCS to broaden their services.

Parsons Child and Family Center was awarded \$20,000 to continue the Behavioral Health Center at Cambridge Central School. Providing access to mental health care is difficult and yet extremely important in our rural communities.

The Cambridge Valley Rescue Squad was awarded \$19,000 to purchase a Lifepak 15 emergency monitor and defibrillator, in addition to \$10,000 for emergency COVID 19 relief in April 2020.

The Center for Nursing and Rehabilitation at Hoosick Falls will receive \$19,710 to purchase wheelchairs, bariatric beds, and oxygen concentrators.

The Easton-Greenwich Rescue Squad was awarded \$15,000 to purchase video laryngoscopes, ZOLL Pro AEDs, binder lifts, portable suction units, extrication helmets and clothing, and a Toughbook laptop.

The Mary McClellan Foundation has fulfilled an agreement to subsidize \$100,000 to a local Glens Falls Hospital doctor as part of a retention package over five years. We hope to match this gift for more doctors soon. We believe that maintaining primary care in our rural communities is of utmost importance.

The Greenwich First Responders (Greenwich Fire Department) received \$8,928 to purchase software and a laptop to manage real-time patient care. This money will also fund ZOLL AED Plus Trainers and replacement pads to continue their stellar community outreach and training.

Warren-Washington RSVP was awarded \$6,000 to fund the medical transportation program. This program provides rides to medical appointments for seniors in our community and they are up and running with attention to COVID safety precautions.

The Salem Rescue Squad received \$20,000 to purchase of a Stryker MTS power load fastener system, in addition to \$10,000 for emergency COVID 19 relief in April 2020.

Twin Rivers, PC in Hoosick Falls was awarded \$10,000 to fund the construction of Airborne Infection Isolation Rooms.

The Town of Hoosick Rescue Squad received \$20,000 toward their LifePak Monitor Enhancement Program, in addition to \$10,000 for emergency COVID 19 relief in April 2020.

The Town of Salem was awarded \$1625 to purchase a ZOLL AED plus for the Bancroft Library.
